

How to access the national norms




This is how you access the national norms. Begin on the **groups area** and then select the range of grades that you'd like to see. Then select the measure you'd like to view. Finally, select the national norms and click refresh. Your national norms will appear and at the bottom of your screen you can click the print button to generate these as a PDF. Now, let's take a deeper look at how to navigate the benchmark screen.



Benchmark screen: You may want to filter your students by specific classrooms, caseloads, grade levels measure and timeframe. In addition, you will want to choose the criteria for comparison, NATIONAL NORMS. You can also choose the type of report you wish to pull. Once you're done making your selections, click refresh. In this example you see a benchmark comparison of OR across all of Mr. Johnson's 5th grade students in the winter and comparing them to the national norms.

The first student has a pink alert which indicates the need for an initial progress monitoring schedule or the need to adjust an existing schedule. The gray alert bar indicates the student is below or well below average in a different measure. You can set up progress monitoring right from this screen by clicking on the pink icon or the manage monitoring. The vertical bars indicate the students status towards their progress monitoring goal. The bar will show pink if the student is not projected to meet their ending goal, green if they are projected to meet their ending goal, and grey if more data is needed to make a determination.
